Available 2017 ALNNJ Scholarships for College Students:

Clarence Tabor Memorial Scholarship Award

Given to undergraduate students entering their fifth and final year of Architecture or to graduate students. The award is based on scholastic excellence, attitude toward the profession, probable success as an architect, and need for financial assistance.

Albert O. Halse Memorial Award

Given to undergraduate students for excellence in architectural delineation and/or architectural models.

Architects League Scholastic Achievement Award

Given to graduate and undergraduate students for scholastic excellence in architectural design.

Scholarships are available to New Jersey residents who are attending an NAAB accredited school of architecture in the United States of America and whose permanent residence is in one of the following New Jersey counties: Bergen, Hudson, Passaic, or Sussex. Applicants are required to include a general statement, official transcript, (2) recommendation letters and examples of their work with their completed application. Deadline: All applications and submittal requirements must be postmarked or hand delivered no later than noon on **Monday May 8, 2017 at 5PM**. The award certificates will be presented at an awards dinner of the Architects League in June. We invite those receiving scholarships to attend with their family.
