



Please follow us on Facebook and the website alnnj.org to keep up to date with our schedule. We will see you all very soon. Be safe and take care.



The "i"s Have it:



So, with a thank you to our contributors, enjoy the special images your colleagues have found on these wonderous devices and chosen to share with us all!







"Designer of Dreams"

Thursday, September 21, 2023

Our membership meeting was hosted at the Coronet Custom Lighting facility in Totowa, NJ. Tours of the impressive custom manufacturing plant were followed by a delicious Italian Buffet and a visual presentation of Carl Kemm Loven's impressive portfolio of work. Given by Stacey Kliesch, AIA and Kathleen Walker (Glen Rock historian), the efforts to preserve the vast documentation and the actual residences themselves were also discussed. After Loven's early student travels in Europe, he returned to the United States, influenced and inspired to design the highly detailed French Norman style homes which found great popularity in affluent northern NJ.

IN MEMORIAM



Myron Goldfinger, AIA 1933-2023

Myron Goldfinger, whose monumental modernist homes around New York made him a favorite architect of the city's rich and powerful during the 1980s, died on July 20 in Westchester County.

Mr. Goldfinger designed his homes by amassing basic shapes — half-circles, blocks, triangles — into dramatic sculptural statements that seem both modern and ancient. Myron Goldfinger was born in Atlantic City, New Jersey.



Norman H. Pfeiffer, FAIA 1940-2023

Norman H. Pfeiffer, a bicoastal architect who for more than a half-century restored, reimagined and created civic spaces that enhanced New York landmarks and helped revitalize downtown Los Angeles.

Mr. Pfeiffer was also a founding partner of Hardy Holzman Pfeiffer Associates in New York City.


