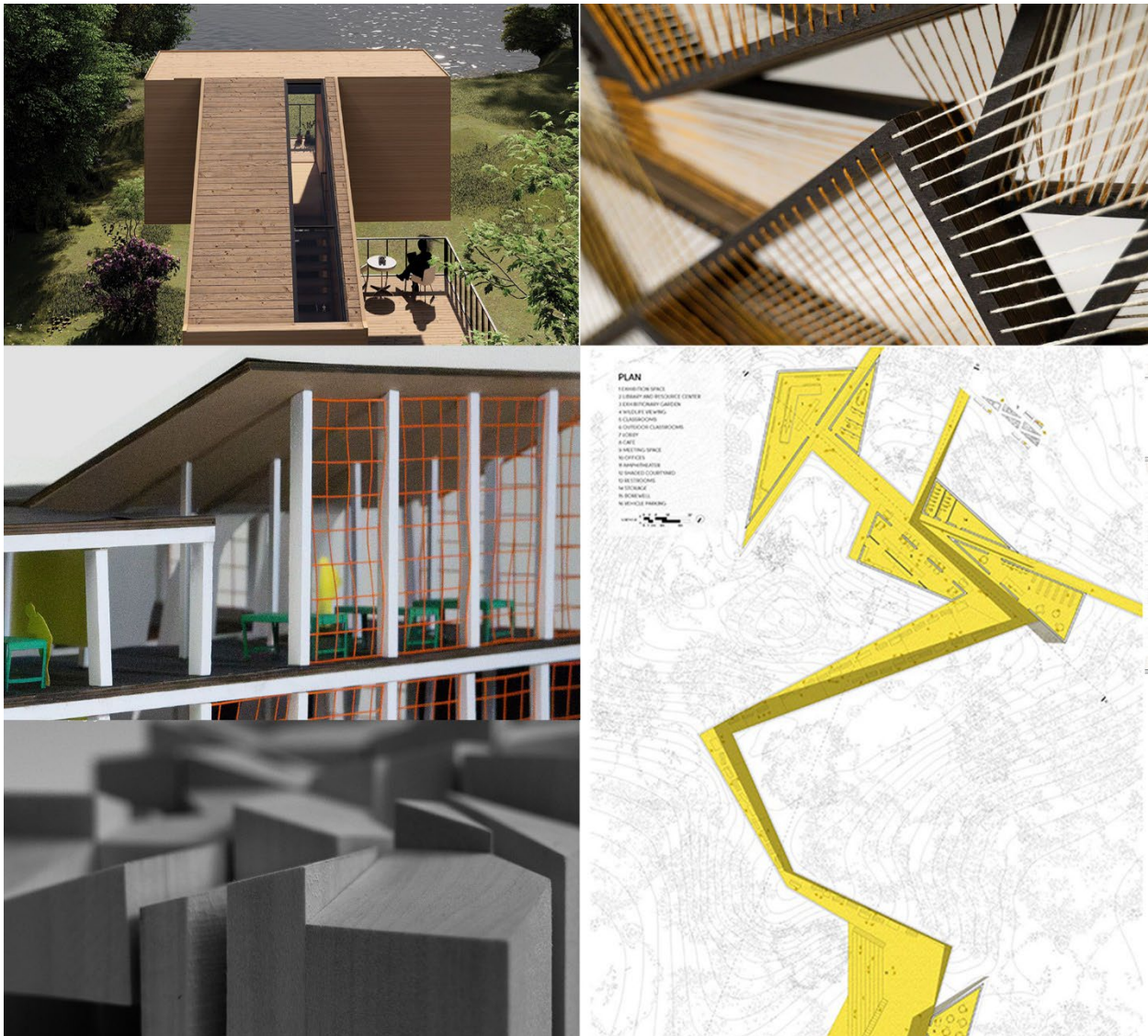


Lillian Marsh

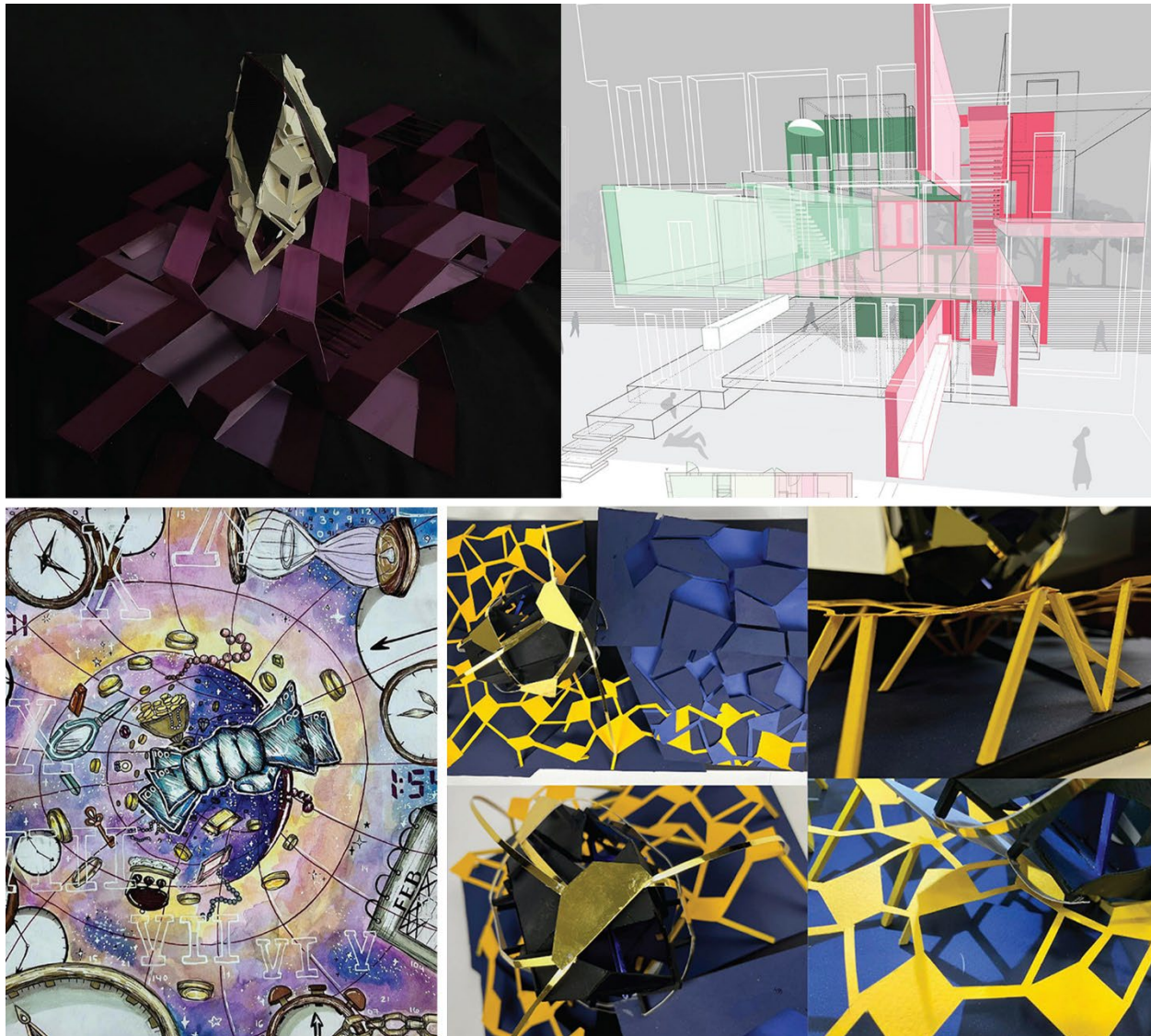


Elisha Santos

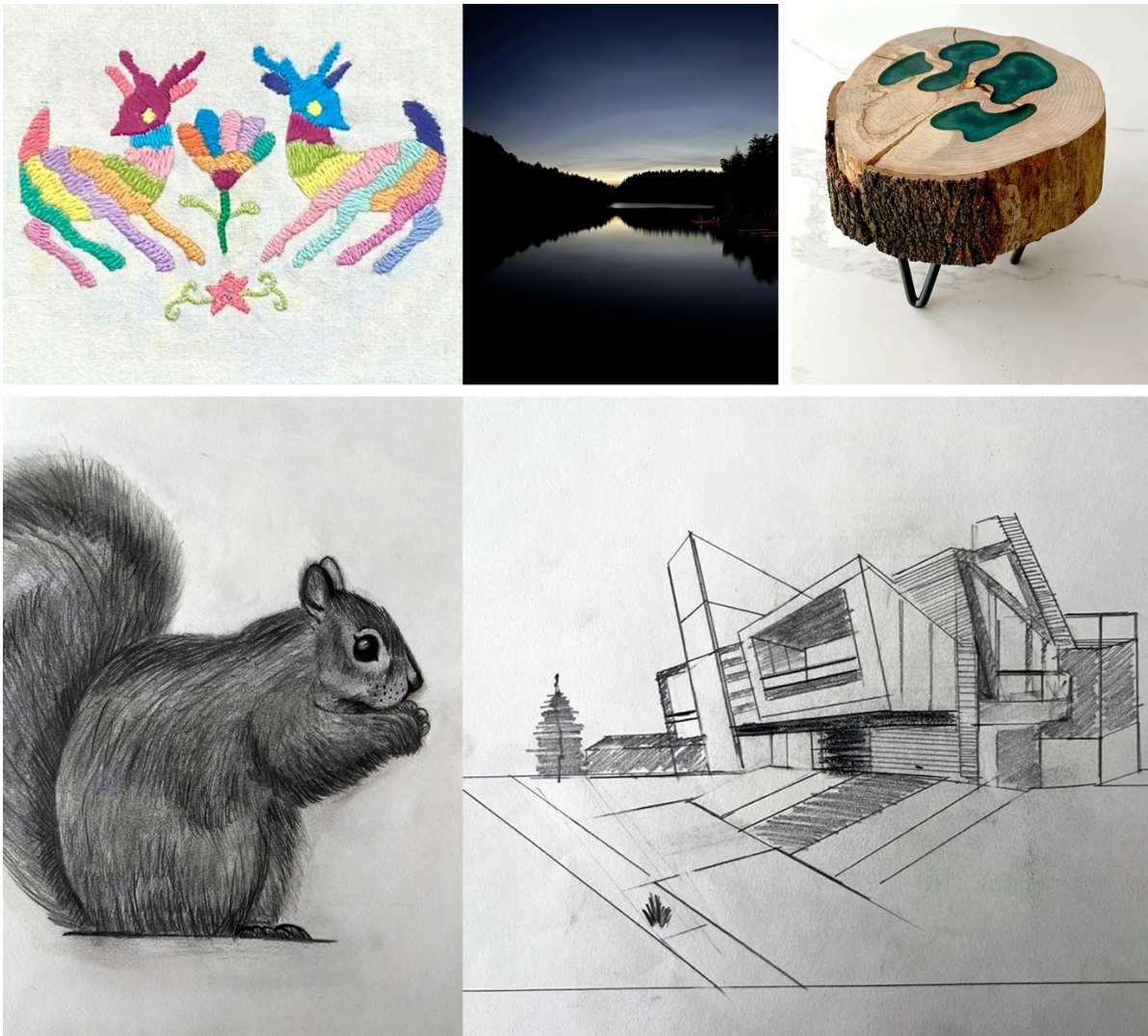


**Alexa Cuevas
